Animal of the Month: Black-capped Chickadee

At Home Activity: Bark Owls

What you need:

- Tree bark
- 2 acorns or tree cones
- Twigs
- Pumpkin or sunflower seeds
- Hot glue

How to:

- 1.Explore your local park or forest and gather tree bark, twigs and acorns/tree cones from the forest floor.
- 2. Carefully break the bark you find into the shape of an owl
- 3. Glue the 2 acorn caps or tree cones onto the bark to be the owl's eyes
- 4. Glue the pumpkin or sunflower seed pointing down between the eyes to be the owl's beak
- 5. Glue the owl to a twig to display it!
