

NASP BC Tournament FAQ

Registration

1. Where can I register my team?

There are two steps to registering your team, found at two different links. You must register AND pay for your team on or before April 26th to be entered into the tournament. Please have all your students' information ready at the time of registration. To register your team, go [here](#). A payment link will be sent to you after successfully registering.

2. I registered my team but never paid. Did I miss a step?

Yes, payment for the tournament is collected on a different website. You must complete the registration AND payment on or before April 26th to be entered into the tournament. A payment link will be sent to you after successfully registering.

3. My team is made up of students from grade 8 to grade 11. Do I have to register the grade 8 students as a separate team?

If you do not have enough grade 8 students to form a separate middle school team (minimum 12 students), they may join the high school (grade 9 – 12) team. The general rule is "archers can always shoot above their age level but never below."

4. I do not have enough students for the minimum number to form a team (12). Can they still compete in the tournament?

Yes, your students can still compete, however they will not be entered into the Team Division. You can still set up your range and shoot as a team, but your scores will only be entered into the Individual Division. Your students are still eligible to place in the Individual Division for their age group.

5. Can my school send multiple teams to the tournament?

Yes, schools can have a maximum of three teams competing in the tournament. All teams must be comprised of 12 to 16 students and have a minimum of four male and four female students.

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6. I have more than 16 students interested in competing in the tournament. Can they all still compete?

Depending on how many students you have, you can form multiple teams. For example, if you have 25 students who want to compete, you can form two teams, made up of 12 and 13 students each.

If you do not have enough students to form a second team, you can enter your remaining students as individuals. Their scores will only be entered in the Individual Division and NOT the Team Division. You must decide at the time of registration which students will be competing in the Team Division, and which will only be competing in the Individual Division.

7. My team does not meet the requirement to have 4 male and 4 female students. Can they still compete?

Yes, your students can still compete in the Individual Division. Unfortunately, they cannot compete in the Team Division.



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The Range

1. What distance are the shooting lines set to?

All participating students will shoot from a 10-meter and 15-meter distance.

2. How many flights are for practice and how many are for score?

From each distance (10 and 15 meters), archers will complete four ends. An end is a round with five arrows. The first end will be for practice, and the remaining three flights will be for score.

Archers will complete a total of eight ends, with two for practice and six for score.

3. Do I need line officials?

Yes. To train lane officials, please watch this [video](#). Line officials should be impartial, responsible students, parent volunteers, or teachers.

4. Do all students need to shoot at the same time?

Yes, all students must shoot on the same range on the same day. Coaches should find a time that works for all their students to facilitate their tournament if they are competing virtually.

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Scoring

1. How do I document the score?

Scores must be documented on the NASP Tournament App to be considered valid. Archers must use the provided score cards and a photo must be taken before the arrows are removed. Scoring instructions for the app can be found [here](#).

If you are unable to use the NASP Tournament App, they can use official NASP Scorecards. NASP Scorecards will be mailed to you after successfully registering. Scorecards must be either mailed or scanned back to NASP BC for submission.

For scores to be counted toward scholarships, there must be photo evidence submitted via the NASP Tournament App. Scorecard submissions will NOT be counted toward scholarships unless done at the in-person tournament.

2. Who can document the score?

Scores must be documented by a teacher or lane official. We ask that all scores be submitted to the NASP Tournament App. Alternatively, you can document scores via NASP Scorecards. NASP Scorecards will be mailed to you. Scorecards must be either mailed or scanned back to NASP BC for submission.

3. What if a student scores higher during a practice flight? Are they able to use that score instead?

Unfortunately, students are not able to submit the scores from their practice flights, even if they are higher than their flights for score.

4. When do I have to submit my team's scores by?

Scores must be submitted on the same day you run your tournament flights. All scores must be submitted by May 11th. All flights must be completed between April 29th and May 11th.

5. When will the winners be announced?

Winners will be announced via email and on our social media platforms the week after the tournament concludes. Awards will be mailed out at this time as well.
